- SOCIAL MEDIA I recently listened to the Trials Australia podcast with Bernie Schreiber (1979 world champion, 4 time NATC champion, 1982 SSDT winner and an AMA Hall of Fame inductee) also successful sports marketer who launched RYP and Sherco in the USA among others. He observed that the current trend of posting YouTube clips of the amazing feats by the professional riders, while very impressive, is actually hurting the sport. He contends that interested onlookers perceive this as dangerous, and are scared away by what they see, rather than being encouraged to take up trials. But we all know that this is not the reality but merely the talent of the top few riders. The answer lies in posting more media of what we "ordinary" riders get up to, which is much more achievable, and hopefully attainable to a newbie. So, to that end, I encourage you to take short video clips of yourself and your mates and post it on our Facebook Group and YouTube. Let's encourage more riders to join our wonderful family!

All we can say is that from the moment the cars started to arrive, we realised this was going to be a Vertigo show.





I have a Lifetime Achievement award from Motorsport South Africa and I have observed a World Round in Duluth Minnesota. Besides my 15 SA National Championships, I would say my best achievement was finishing #4 in the USA in my rookie year! Bruce and I also managed to crack the front cover of the 2006 FIM World Round Spectators Guide!

Some of the countries I have competed or done shows in: USA, England, Spain, Australia, Pakistan, Angola, Zambia and of course Botswana and Swaziland. Oh and I can twist my tongue upside-down (Ed: your wife must love you for this), and I have 2 Gold Roof of Africa medals under my belt!

There we are ladies and gents, proof that he doesn't ride his bike everyday despite what we all thought!

We have been unable to interview any riders that have bought this machine, so until a test unit comes available (which has already been offered by FAST Gas Gas), we will have to rely on the marketing info provided by the manufacturer. machines available in the market. Watch this space. I can tell you that I had the opportunity to ride the demo unit at the last Twin Shock event, and I have to say that it far exceeded my expectations. The bike feels very well balanced, and I certainly think we will be seeing quite a few of these in our club in the not too distant future.
